RETURN TO SHOOTING COVID-19 RULES

We will be asking members to book in advance if they would like to shoot as we did last September/October. This enables us to allocate targets and designated waiting/setting up areas to comply with self-distancing rules.

- Target boss centres will be a minimum of 3.66m apart
- Maximum of two archers per target boss or one household/bubble
- Up to 10 people maximum per clout
- Social distancing must be maintained off the line
- Cleanse hands before and after shooting

BACK ON TARGET...

It is important to remember that most of us have not shot for several months and that bow weights will be feeling a little tough to pull. The key thing to remember is to build slowly, take breaks, and listen to your body. nobody wants to be injured on their first outing!

it is important to check your nocking point and the brace height of your string as we return. Waxing your string and checking for any wear is essential and good safety practice. Here are some helpful videos:
