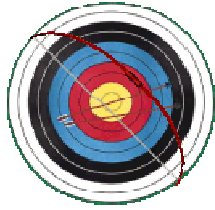

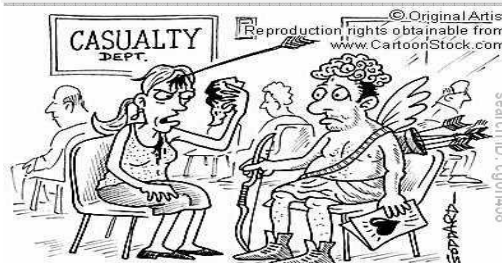
A number of members have asked what is happening with our website as it is not being updated frequently enough.
